



**TALKING NOTES FOR H E SUSAN KIIHIKA, NAKURU COUNTY
GOVERNOR, DURING THE ISSUANCE OF TITLES AT KISIMA
FARM, NJORO ON 30TH JANUARY, 2026**

1. Total acreage of Kisima Farm—1,112 acres
2. A total of 433 Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) from Pipeline are being resettled on Kisima Farm. Each family has been allocated 2 acres of land. Plans to move the families from Pipeline to Kisima Farm have been finalized by the Government.
3. 45 families who have been long term squatters on Kisima Farm have been factored in the issuance of titles. Each family has been allocated one acre of land.
4. Kiptuko Group Members—integrated landless people have also been included in the resettlement plant. 191 families have each been allocated quarter an acre of land.
5. The remaining group of IDPs at Pipeline in Nakuru will be resettled at Donga Farm in Subukia. Details about the resettlement will be released once the process is concluded
6. Issues at Pipeline: Overcrowded, crime and lack of basic facilities. A total of 844 families were settled in Pipeline in the wake of 2007-8 post elections violence. Efforts to resettle them begun in 2013.
7. Accelerated land titling, secured more than 3,000 titles. In Mutukanio—Kiptangwanyi, 3,000 titles cleared. Ongoing surveys in Kihingo—Njoro, Maji Tamu—Rongai, and Subukia to deliver 2,100 titles by June, while verification in Bahati and Dundori for 1,000 titles. Spatial planning in Naivasha Industrial Area, Gilgil Kampi Somali, Leleshwa, and Sitoito will unlock 5,300 additional titles.
